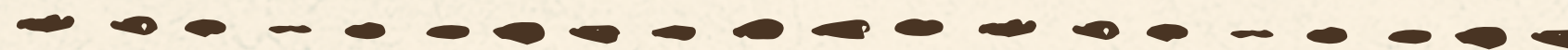

Introduction

Student Exchange Program:

1. One or two semesters in a university abroad
2. Tuition fee only to Technion
3. Credit Transfer (subject to Home Faculty's Approval)
4. Application and cancellation fee



- Exchange Agreement signed with the Host University
- Status at Technion - Study Break
- Assistance from Student Exchange Coordinator
- Student is responsible for travel, food and housing

Who can join the Exchange program?

- Cumulative average of 80 for Science and Technology students, 85 for Architecture students
- Students should have no disciplinary record or improper academic status
- Completed at least 4 Technion semesters by the time of the exchange program
- Must return to Technion for at least one semester at the end of their semester abroad
- Students must take a course that is conducted in English at Technion before leaving for exchange

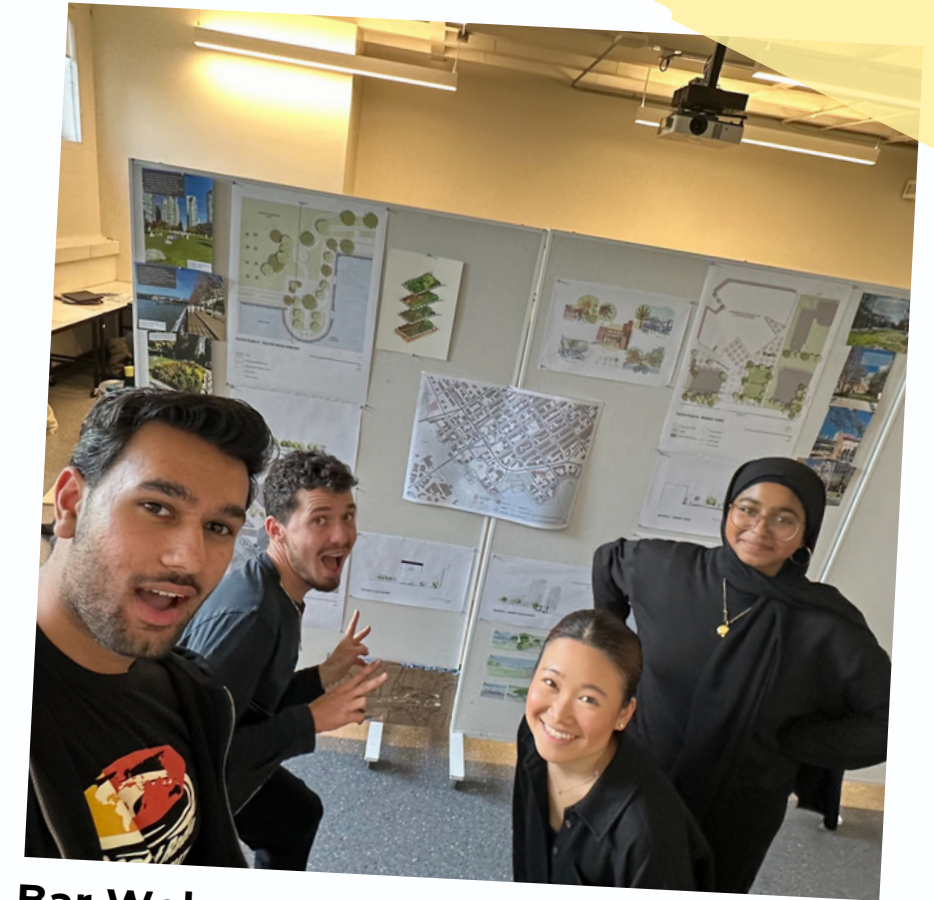

Application Documents

- Application form – online - <https://regint.technion.ac.il/> - Choose 'Outgoing Technion Students'
- Faculty Approval Form (Architecture students – centralized approval) (List of Faculty Advisors)
- Transcript of Grades in English - can be downloaded from [here](#)
- Choice of 5 Universities - ranking
- Updated resume (CV) in English
- Motivation letter - Explain the reasons why you would like to take part in the Technion Student Exchange Program
- Proof of English Proficiency - TOEFL or IELTS if required/completed or the relevant letter of approval from the Faculty of Humanities at Technion, choose one! Exemption, Advanced B
- Erasmus+ Financial Statement Form must include students' monthly income, additional scholarships granted, etc. This is required, if the student is interested in requesting an ERASMUS+ scholarship.

Application and Nomination timeline



Timeframe and Deadlines

All applications must be submitted by **December 24, 2023**

Student Exchange Coordinator will send a confirmation as to eligibility for student exchange to the relevant students until **the end of January 2024**

Student Exchange Coordinator will nominate students to Host Universities for Fall/Spring semester according to host university deadline (additional documents will be required – TOEFL, application form, updated transcript)

The Host University will send confirmation of acceptance to Student Exchange Coordinator and/or student according to its own deadline



FAQ

- Exams: NO special permission for MOED B or missed exams. You will be able to take the next available exam.
- Students cannot be registered for courses at the Technion during their exchange semester
- **NO** guarantee for studies at any particular host university
- **NO** guarantee of scholarship (Erasmus+)
- **Please do NOT contact universities before nomination**
- Student's responsibility: All costs, deadlines, requirements and processes are to be monitored by student
- Who decides: **Final decision depends on the host university**
- Abiding regulations: Students must abide by the host university's code of conduct, as well as the Technion's, during their semester abroad



Fees and Charges

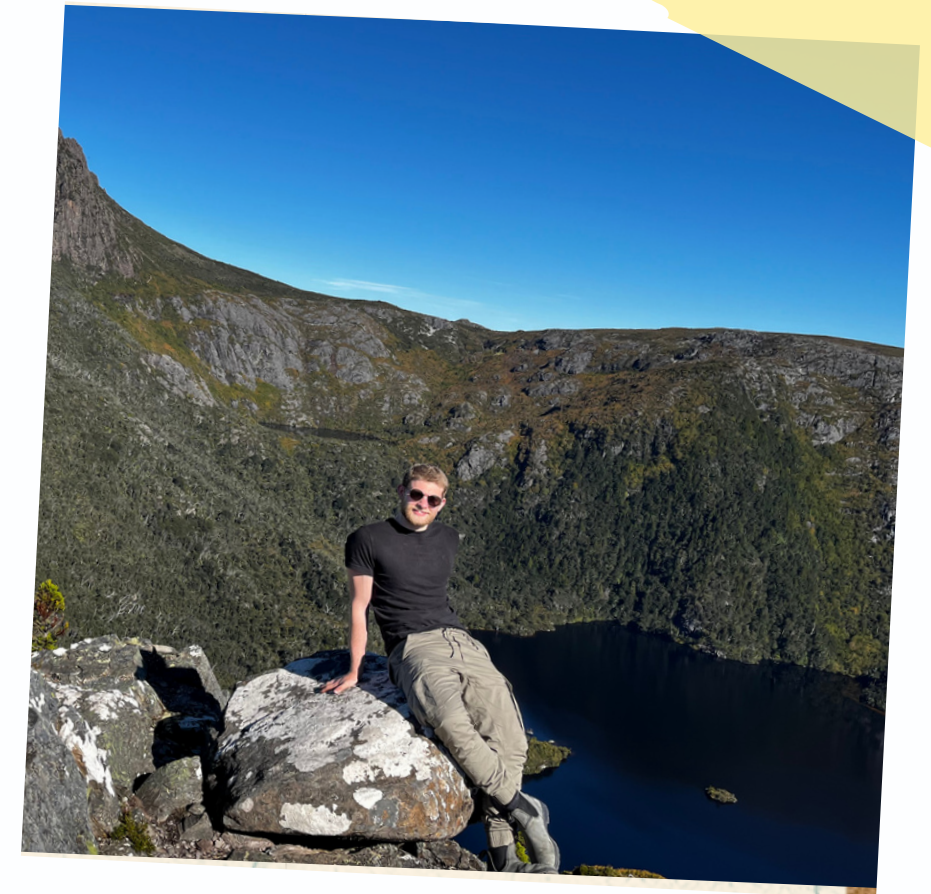
- Regular tuition fee paid to Technion
- **190 NIS** - non-refundable application fee, charged through tuition by the Student Accounts Department
- **300 NIS** - Late Application Fee
- **300 NIS** - Cancellation fee, **BEFORE** nomination to host university
- **650 NIS** - **Cancellation** fee **AFTER** nomination/acceptance to host university

The Dean of student's office will offer a scholarship to candidates from less advantaged socio-economic backgrounds.

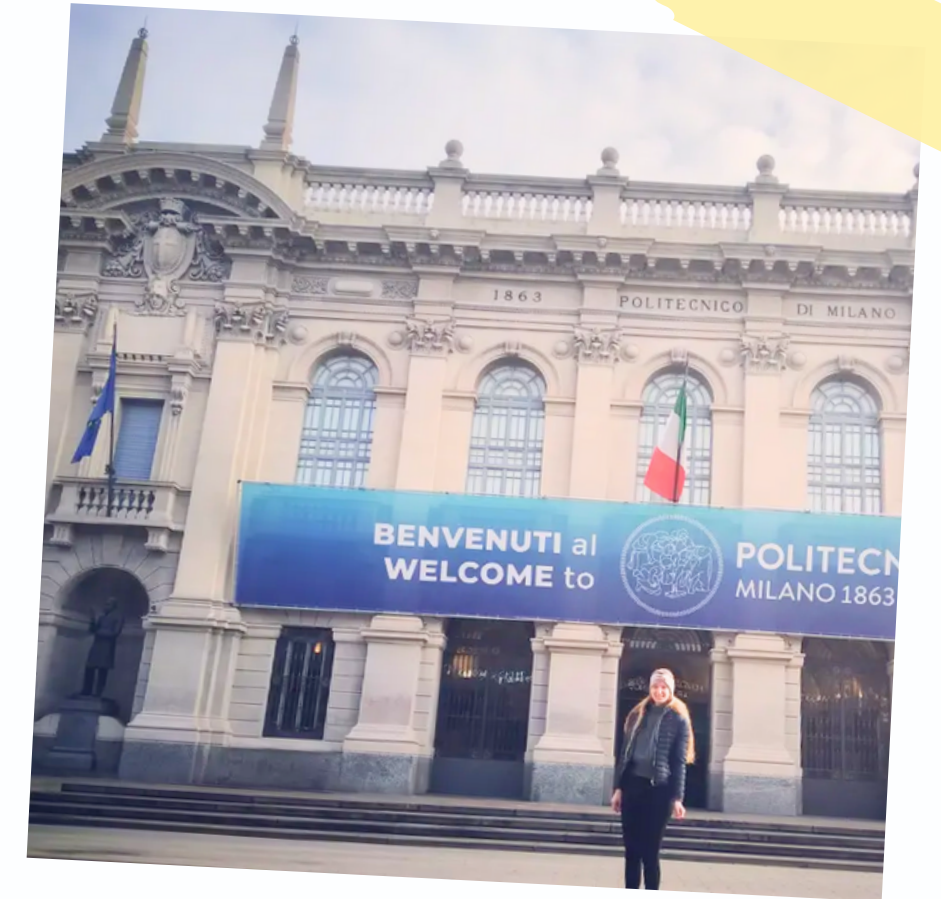
The Exchange office will send a call for each semester with detailed information about the deadlines and registration process.

Global Engineering Education Exchange (GE3)

- Consortium of 70 universities in over 20 countries
- There are only a few GE3 places available for Technion students.
- Only top students will be chosen for GE3 slots.
- Choose GE3 in the drop-down menu in the online application system.
- Once your nomination is approved, you can start the application via the GE3 website
- Please make sure to check the information page of your preferred universities.

Limited Spots for Architecture students (50% Engineering Curriculum)

Erasmus+

- Erasmus+ Program (EU's program) offers scholarships to students within the framework of the Erasmus+ Program.
- The amount of scholarship may vary according to:
 - differences in living costs between Israel and the destination country
 - number of students for a grant
 - distance between countries
 - availability of other grants.
- The amount of scholarship ~ 750EUR-900 EUR/month
- Preference will be given to candidates from less advantaged socio-economic backgrounds.


The scholarship is not guaranteed, not even if we have an agreement.
